Curriculum revision, addition of new courses and value-added courses takes into account the feedback from all relevant stakeholders and guidelinesof the Regulatory Bodies.

1.3 - Curriculum Enrichment

1.3.1 - Institution integrates crosscutting issues relevant to Gender, Environment and Sustainability, Human Values, Health Determinants, Right to Health Issues, Emerging demographic changes and Professional Ethics in the curricula

The curriculum at DPU is holistic, includes cross-cutting issues, which are integrated in POs-COs and teaching-learning of core curricula.

- 1. Sensitization and women empowerment is ensured through programs like Beti Bachao, breast-feeding awareness during World Breastfeeding Week, womens' self-defense programs and initiatives of the Yashoda Human Milk Bank.
- 2.Environment and Sustainability issues are prioritized in all programs based on UN sustainable goals through environmental science topics such as global warming, disaster management under National Flagship Program, etc. and activities like Unnat Bharat Abhiyan and Swachchata Pakhwada. Plastic use on campus is strictly banned.
- 3. Human Values and Ethics are strongly emphasized in curriculum and graduate attributes. DPU has established UNESCO chair in Bioethics and "UNESCO Bioethics Core Curriculum" is followed.
- 4. Health Determinants comprising of the social and economic environment are incorporated in the curriculum, also the extension and outreach activities are conducted for sensitisation of people about health and hygiene besides health camps, and national health programs like Mahatma Phule Jan Arogya Yojana is also available.
- 5. Right to Health Issues and emerging demographic changes are learnt through various sessions on health care management, health economics, etc. DPU was recently recognized as "Charity Hospital at

poor patient's doorstep" by Government of Maharashtra.

- 1. Field Visitsand Field projects enable students to examine their career interests and prepare them for careers beyond graduation. Field visits strengthen transferable skills that are sought by employers, augment team skills and networking opportunities.
- 2. Internship postings in all health science disciplines are followed meticulously, providing hands-on experience, enabling them to develop work competencies as efficient health professionals. Field projects are undertaken during internship as a part of social responsibility and community outreach programs. Work done during internship documented in log-book.
- 3.Industry internship: For MBA program students undergo industry internships in tandem with the industry gaining insight into the alignment of course curriculum with industry requirements. Students share their knowledge and understanding of the industry after student internship program (SIP).
- 4.Research Projects: Medical and Dental undergraduate students undertake ICMR-STS and DPU STS projects every year. Biotechnology undergraduate students also undertake research projects. Research projects are mandatory for all PG Programs.
- 5.Community postings are a mandatory requirement for students in the Health Science programs. DPU has a network of fourteen Satellite Health Centers for providing opportunities to the students for community-based learning.

Students rigorously learn clinical skills on patients in wards and out-patient clinics besides practicing in skills laboratory. Students undertake community visits, internships, industrial/field trips, research projects and hands on training workshops.

Integrated/Inter-disciplinary learning

DPU has ensured inter-disciplinary learning by incorporating interdisciplinary courses across all Faculties. Integration of

teaching-learning is at both horizontal and vertical.

Participatory learning

Participatory learning for students by examining patients in OPD and wards through case-histories and formative feedback during the presentations.

Students develop multiple perspectives in solving real-world problems by case studies and problem-based learning scenarios.

The academic calendar is prepared at institutional level and approved by Faculty, Academic Council (AC) and Board of Management (BoM). The Board of Examinations (BOE) prepares the schedule of examinations and appoints paper-setters, examiners, and moderators

to ensure proper conduct of examinations/assessments.

The papers are assessed through a strictly defined Central Assessment Programme (CAP) protocol to ensure accuracy, efficiency and reliability. CCTV surveillance and mobile jammers are used in examination halls. Results are declared within a week's time.

In 2020-2021, revision of evaluation scheme was undertaken for BBA and MBA. The proportion of external and internal assessment marks was revised from 60:40 to 50:50.

Continuous Assessment methods like problem-solving assignments, MCQs, SAQs, Case Studies, Objective Structured Clinical/Practical Examinations (OSCE/OSPE), Viva-Voce, Presentations, group discussions and workplace-based assessment are routinely used for various programmes and courses.

Online counselling was used for provisional admissions to various programmes during the COVID -19 pandemic. Online grievance application and redressal system is implemented and is functioning well.

Outcome Analysis of examination results is carried out by all constituent units annually. Faculty training workshops in new assessment methods are regularly conducted.

The collaboration and partnership of DPU with industry have helped to improve the quality of education in terms of excellence, modernization, collaboration and self-reliance.DPU has also organized various workshops to strengthen teaching-learning methods. It is done by way of inviting senior industry professionals to share their rich experience with the students. These sessions have helped the students in applying those theoretical concepts into practice. The students of Business School and Biotechnology & Bioinformatics regularly opt for summer internship programs in collaboration with aforementioned industries. Out of the total 89 workshops, 6 workshops were conducted on IPR, 4 research methodology, 67 on good clinical practices and 12 on industry academia collaborations.

The Centre conducts workshops and seminars on IPR and entrepreneurship for students and faculties on protection of IP, promote entrepreneurial skills besides providing logistical support from Ideation, incubation to post incubation stage. Constituent units have filed 49 patents/copyrights during the year. Faculties have undertaken Innovation Ambassador Training from Ministry of Education, Innovation Cell.Consultancy Policy of Vidyapeeth provides quiding principles and procedures for consultancy services by faculties, provided it does not conflict with the interests of the University. Consultancyservices have stimulated research and scholarly exchanges besides applying knowledge for solving real life problems. Faculties facilitate knowledge and technology transfer towards economic and social impact.

- 4.1.1 The Institution has adequate physical facilities for teaching –learning, skills acquisition etc.
- Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune has its spacious campus of 42.5 acres at Pimpri and Tathawade in the Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipal Corporation, an urban area. It comprises the following:

ICT-enabled Classrooms and seminar halls: Academic infrastructure of nine constituent units includes 67 well equipped Classrooms, 150 Demonstration rooms, and 48 Seminar Halls.

Facilities for Clinical learning: There are 2011 beds of Medical hospital, 425 Dental chairs, 325 of Ayurved hospital and 43 Homoeopathy hospital for bed side clinical teaching-learning.

Learning in the Community: DPU has ten Satellite Health Centers covering Rural (RHTC) and Urban (UHTC) areas.

Provisions of Museums and Skill Labs:

Provisions of physical infrastructure, learning resources, clinical learning resources, health care facilities, museums, skill laboratories are over and above the requirements of Regulatory Bodies.

Animal House:

Animal house is registered under Committee for the Purpose of Control and Supervision of Experiments on Animals (CPCSEA) (14/02/2017, R.No.619/PO/02/ReBI/S/02/CPCSEA) and maintained by Department of Pharmacology.

AYUSH Related Learning Cum Therapy Center

As a part of AYUSH systems of medicine during multi-diagnostic camps Ayurveda and Homoeopathy Hospitals provide a wide variety of treatments for acute and chronic medical conditions. In-house teaching pharmacy 'Sudhatatava' is GMP (MH/PZ3/ GMP/6095400) certified.

Yoga Centre - Yoga, meditation and aerobics classes are practiced by students regularly for self-discipline, concentration, fitness and relaxation. Ayurveda College has certificate course on yoga.

Recreational facilities - Two Auditoriums are available with 1000 and 250 Capacity that is used for cultural and other student council activities.

Gymnasium: DPU has provided well-equipped four gymnasiums, two for boys, two for girls and one open gymnasium. Zumba Dance facility is also available at Gymnasium.

Average of about 75 major & minor surgeries are being carried out in both hospitals every month with facility of live telecast. Daily of 6,675 Pathology, Biochemistry and Microbiology investigations and 1,030 daily radiological investigations are conducted.

Hospital Information Management System (HIMS)

A complete HIMS is developed by the Software Development Cell (SDC) of the Vidyapeeth. The students of Medical, Dental, Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Nursing, Physiotherapy and Optometry are trained to use the HIMS.

Through regular clinical and multi-specialty postings the students get hands-on training in the respective teaching hospitals.

Experience based training includes case study, case presentation, seminars, symposia, bedside teaching,

DPU has ensured best library resources at every constitute unit. Each department has also its own departmental library. All the libraries subscribe to both print and e-journals of repute. They also subscribe to standard databases that include EBSCO HOST,

SCOPUS, J-GATE, KNOWLEDGE HUB, and ELSEVIER CLINICALKEY and CLINICALFLEX STUDENT. The database facilitates search for title, subject, author, publisher, and keywords.

Every constitute unit has its own Library Committee. This committee is renewed and reconstituted at regular intervals. It meets at least twice in a year and makes recommendations regarding new purchases, library organization, facilities and so on.

Biometric attendance system: Entry and exit for all users from the library register their attendance in the library through biometric attendance system.

Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system is used in registration and as anti-theft protection.

The DPU has state-of-the-art Data Centre with separate IT and SDC units. Data Centre provides comprehensive technical IT support including software development, procurement and maintenance of hardware and liaising with software providers.

The DPU has about 1669 computers of which 1071 have been utilized exclusively for academic purpose by the students and the faculty members and the remaining are used for administrative work.

The computer facility in the library is utilized effectively by students for accessing e-learning resources from morning till evening. Frequent up-gradation of IT infrastructure has ensured high speed connectivity to these computers that are readily available to the faculty members and students. Hostels are also having Wi-Fi connectivity.

Up-gradations:

Wi-Fi services are available in classrooms, library and all the buildings of the Vidyapeeth. The classrooms have been upgraded with interactive display boards/ TVs making learning more effective. In addition, audio-video recording facility has been created for the development of e-content. The e-content is then uploaded on Vidyapeeth portal for access by the students for learning.

The installation of Hypervisor i.e. (Virtualization) has converted physical server into multiple virtual machines for each database module eliminating future purchases.

DPU makes use of lecture capturingwhere all classes are recorded in real time and made available on the Vidyapeethonline platform.

The content development, editing and publishing are well defined processes at DPU. Content is peer reviewed and checked for quality and plagiarism. For new program development, a thorough process is followed right from need assessment to courseware development. The program development process at DPU goes through three stages namely: program formulation, instructional design and development of courseware.

The software used is Shortcut open-source video editor, iMovie video editing for Mac, Audacity and Catwalk by Bandlab for audio editing and mixing, Adobe Premier and Adobe Aftereffect. The teachers and students are making use of e-resources through e-library and internet connectivity.

Case Study - Timely Response to Covid 19 Pandemic.

The Covid 19 Pandemic was a big challenge to the entire humanity worldwide that affected the Global Academic system as well.

Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, in accordance with the guidelines putforth by the Central/State Government and the local municipal Councils, made sure that all Academic, Research, Extension and Clinical activities continued without any halt.

All statutory and Non Statutory bodies, various committees and the IQAC of the Vidyapeeth, in unison with the constituent units streamlined the Academic, Clinical, Research, Extension and Welfare activities by online/offline meetings for deciding and deploying the plan of action in the exceptional scenario of Covid-19. Blended mode of Teaching-Learning and Evaluation (Online/Offline) was adopted as per guidelines from regulatory authorities. Faculty and students were connected through the DPU-ERP for Teaching-Learning as well as evaluation process and students were provided all the e-resources required to meet their curriculum requirements.

The Medical and AyurvedHospital provided Covid-19 care and vaccination services besides distribution of Arsenic Album (Homeopathy Hospital) and engaged in collaborative efforts to combat Covid-19 pandemic.

This decentralized and participative effort made sure that the Academic, Research and Clinical activities continued without any major shortcomings.

Fees collected is fixed by the 'Fee Fixation Committee', which is empowered to review and revise the fee structure. The Vidyapeeth allocates the resources under various budget heads following which the institutional budget is prepared by the concerned Head of the institution taking into consideration the annual recurring and non-recurring expenditures. The Finance Committee recommends the budget to the Board of Management for its approval.

The main goal of the strategy for mobilization of funds is to ensure adequate funds flow for maintenance and development expenses for growth and expansion as per DPU-Vision 2025 document.

Optimal utilization of financial resources is done through the Annual Budget exercise. Budget is prepared based on the actual expenditure of the previous year and proposed academic and administrative development. This budget is approved and effectively monitored by the Finance Committee and the Board of Management. Approved budget and actual expenditure is monitored by Internal and External audits.

6.4.3 - Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

Internal Audit: DPU has a policy for Internal and External Audits duly approved by the Finance Committee and Board of Management that ensure financial transactions; pursue the controls and procedures with reasonable assurance that significant risk is being managed properly. Documents related to purchase, stores, cash, bank, maintenance, development passes through the hands of more than two staff which reduces the risk. While the documents are prepared by an accountant, they are also verified and authorized by higher officials.

DPU follows pre-audit to payments procedure wherein after the document has been verified, it goes for audit by the Chartered Accountant.

External Audit: DPU follows an external financial audit mechanism. The financial statements prepared by the institution are independently audited by a firm of Chartered Accountants. The external auditor is appointed by the Board of Management on the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

The external auditor scrutinizes the ledgers of the institution and makes inquiries in respect of transactions recorded. After conducting the audit, they express their opinion in the form of an Audit Report and audited Financial Statements which is placed before the Finance Committee and BOM for approval. Finally, a consolidated financial statement of the Vidyapeeth is prepared.

7.1.3 - Describe the facilities in the Institution for the management of the following types of degradable and non-degradable waste (within 100 - 200 words)

DPU has facilities for management of degradable and non-degradable waste complying with guidelines of Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB). These are as follows:

Solid waste management

Bio- degradable solid waste of canteen and garden is composted in a vermicompost plant installed in DPU campus. Plastic is banned as per directive of Government of Maharashtra and has been strictly observed at DPU.

Liquid waste management

Vidyapeeth has four sewage treatment plants (STP) with a total capacity of 1170 m3/ day to manage the liquid waste. One effluent treatment plant (ETP) with a total capacity of 50 m3/day and two water treatment plants (WTP) with a total capacity of 650 m3/day, have also been installed. The liquid waste management plants have been installed at a cost of more than Rs 65 lacs.

Biomedical waste management

Biomedical waste generated in the Hospitals is disposed as per norms. The waste is collected at the point of generation in prescribed colour coded bags and bins. They are segregated and stored at a specific area and handed over every day to the common disposable facility run by PCMC. All the institutes hold licenses and valid contracts from MPCB, Government of Maharashtra

E-waste management

Vidyapeeth has executed an agreement for disposal of e-waste with J.S. Enterprises along with creating awareness amongst employees and students regarding the same.

Waste recycling system

The wastewater is treated and recycled water is used for landscaping and toilets.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management

Standard protection protocols and guidelines of Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) have been followed to ensure protection from radiation. These include:

- Protection devices like Lead shielding of adequate thickness, thyroid collar etc, is used to prevent exposure to radiation
- "Thermoluminescent Dosimeter" badge is used to monitor radiation exposure.
- All the equipment and layout plan of the Department of Radiodiagnosis and Imaging are approved by AERB.
- Periodic quality assurance, radiation safety survey, and health surveillance is conducted for all radiation generating installations and workers.
- Radiation Safety Committee is constituted.
- Licenses of all radiology equipment are renewed every five years.

Best Practice 1

TITLE: 4TH GENERATION DA VINCI ROBOT FOR ROBOTIC SURGERY

1. Objective

Robotic surgery is a minimally invasive surgery that has dramatically changed the experience of surgery for patients. At DPU the fourth generation, da Vinci surgical system is in use that has enhanced cameras for 3D visualization and surgeon-controlled robotic

arms for precise movements. It allows surgeons to operate on tissues and organs as in open surgery, but through a few small incisions. Robotic surgery facility at DPU provides exposure to postgraduate students in latest surgical technologies. Availability of such advanced technologies has enabled the patients of India to reduce travelling expenditure and hospitalization cost by going abroad.

2. Context

India's first robotic-assisted surgical procedure took place at Delhi in 2002. Dr. Tejas Patel, A cardiac surgeon, with the help of advanced robotics, conducted the world's first telerobotic surgery on a middle-aged woman with blocked artery while sitting 32 kilometres away from the patient. This was the world's first heart surgery from a remote location which was done in India in the year 2018. Currently 500 robotic surgeons have started practicing this type of surgery at government and private healthcare facilities in India. Benefits of this procedure enables shorter post-surgery recovery period, relatively less pain and less blood loss in robotic assisted surgeries. Hence robotic surgery is preferred over open and laparoscopic surgeries. As a result of this robotic surgeries allows the surgeons to perform complex as well as routine procedures through small incisions like traditional laparoscopy.

At Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, has always been at the forefront in advancement in medical technology. At the Centre of excellence for Robotic Surgery, we are changing the way surgeons treat patients. DPU believes in providing exemplary healthcare that translates into better healing, lesser pain, smaller incisions, and reduced hospitalization. The number of procedures performed in any facility is an indicator of expertise and level of quality, which speaks volumes about the institution. For over two decades, surgeons at DPU have led the way towards better healthcare with minimally invasive procedures. As a natural progression towards excellence, the Centre for Robotic Surgery has been established. The services are provided across multiple specialities which cohesively enhance patient outcome. Thus, DPU continues to be the leader in surgical care, offering an extensive panel of surgeons along with trained staff and nurses who are a part of the dedicated robotic surgical team. The Centre of Excellence for Robotic surgery at DPU offers a faster, less painful surgical option so that life can be led to the fullest.

3. The Practice

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Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune conducted the first robotic surgery on 25th June 2018 in Pimpri Chinchwad Municipal Corporation area on a newly installed latest model of the 4th generation, da Vinci Robot, manufactured by Intusive Technologies, CA, USA. A second console for training young surgeons is also provided in addition to the main console of the robotic surgeon. This machine is one of the 4th generation latest models of medical robot. DPU has one out of 3 such machines installed in the state of Maharashtra, only a few more are available all over India. At other places, 3rd generation models are in use. The cost of the machine purchased at DPU is about Rs.25 Crores.

Considering the example of conventional prostate surgery, patients stays in the hospital for 7 to 9 days post-operatively, but post-robotic surgery patient is fit for discharge by 5th day. There is gross reduction in the post-operative pain as evidenced by lower Visual Analogue Score (VAS scores) in patients who undergo robotic surgery. Also, the requirement of narcotic analgesics was significantly reduced. The average length of stay (ALOS) was 5 days and the patient returns to his daily activity much earlier thereby reducing loss of man hours and financial burden on the patients. As the surgery is undertaken via small 1 cm ports (4/5 no's) there is very little postoperative scarring as compared to conventional surgical incisions.

4. Evidence of success

Da Vinci Robot IV Generation with four arms and dual console is only one of its kind among all Medical Colleges in Maharashtra, installed in at DPU in 2018. Since then, there are 52 Robotic surgeries performed at our hospital. These include:

- Radical Prostatectomy
- Radical Hysterectomy
- · Ca Bladder surgeries like cystectomy with ileal conduit.
- Robotic assisted tubal recanalization.
- Robotic cholecystectomy.
- Robotic radical nephrectomy.

5. Problems encountered and resources required

1. Robotic surgery is significantly costlier than conventional laparoscopic procedure/open surgery.

- 2. Insurance companies as of now do not finance robotic surgeries.
- 3. There is lack of patient awareness regarding advantages of robotic surgery.
- 4. Equipment of robotic surgery are expensive to the tune of 22 crores.
- 5. Comprehensive maintenance cost (CMC) is about 95 lakhs/year.
- 6. Consumables used in robotic surgery are also expensive.
- 7. Space requirement for surgical robot is much more and bigger operation theatres are required.
- 8. Training and expertise are required by the surgeon which is also expensive.

BEST PRACTICE 2

TITLE: ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION INITIATIVES AT DPU MEDICAL HOSPITAL

1. Objective:

Organ Donation is retrieving donor's organs like heart, liver, kidneys, intestines, lungs and pancreas, after death or from braindead individuals for the purpose oftransplanting them into another person who needs an organ. It aids in saving the life of terminally ailing patients. DPU being an advanced tertiary health care centre with sophisticated and advanced surgical facilities, instrumentation and procedures, trains PG students from Medical, Surgical and Nursing specialities in human transplantation surgery, treatment, rehabilitation & follow up. The program also endeavours to create awareness about organ transplant and cadaveric organ transplant among donors. Thus, DPU also supports national programmes such as control of blindness.

2. Context:

DPU through its organ donation initiative aims to significantly reduce the mortality rate among patients with major organ failure. With the availability of good number of donors creating awareness about organ donation from live as well as brain dead/cadavers the bridge between the demand and supply of organs can be reduced. With

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our state of art organ transplant facility, the objective is to save lives, improve transplantation outcomes and reduce recipients waiting time. It also increases opportunities for patients without living donors to receive organs from deceased donors. Training of superspecialists as well as postgraduate students in organ transplantation is the need of the hour, that is being partly fulfilled through this initiative.

3. Practice:

DPU has a state of art modular OTs with Da Vinci Robotic Surgical System. This supports organ transplant facility in various departments such as CVTS, Cardiology, Nephrology, Urology, Gastroenterology and Ophthalmology. Internationally qualified superspecialists are available to conduct these procedures. The support system required for the organ transplant surgeries such as critical support services, ICUs, nursing staff and other state of the art support facilities are available at DPU with well-trained manpower.

4. Evidence of success

A great variety of organ transplant procedures have been conducted in DPU for the last several years. The transplants include renal, liver, cornea, and heart. The statistical data for the same is given as follows:

The other critical challenge is management of brain-dead patients who are potential cadaveric donors. Meticulous attention to hemodynamic and hormonal changes with goal directed intensivist management can have a profound impact on organ eligibility and retrieval rates.

DPU Invitro Fertilization and Endoscopy Center is a state-of-the-art facility with a unique approach which is spearheaded by Medical Director and Chief with vast experience and excellence in the field of Assisted Reproductive Techniques (ART), is poised to bring to life and create miracles in the DPU IVF and Endoscopy Center.

RATIONAL FOR THE ACTIVITY:

The facility provides exceptional, personalized reproductive and fertility health care to the patients. The facility follows a three-step approach that is affordable IVF treatment, highly trained gynecologists in IVF with extensive research and development. The advanced facility is designed to ensure maximum safety and minimal stress to the patients during treatment. The proficient team of experts guides the couples from the initial stage when they first arrive at the Centre and advises them to choose the right options. The patient is also educated regarding the various treatment options available and its cost-effectiveness. The quality of the treatment provided at the DPU IVF and Endoscopy Center is on par with the best IVF Centers across the world. While utilizing the latest advances in medicine combined with state-of-the-art techniques, the goal is to treat the patients with comfort and compassion. Regardless of the

patient's situation, the infertility expert at DPU work closely to develop a personalized fertility treatment plan. As a leading destination for fertility treatments, DPU IVF & Endoscopy Center offers hope to patients around the world. At the Center, the patient's dreams are taken seriously, and the team is dedicated to fulfilling and realizing them.

OUTCOMES ACHIEVED:

At the DPU IVF & Endoscopy Center, we strive to provide the best fertility care from maintaining the highest medical, scientific, academic standards and supporting them through every stage of their journey to parenthood. The center is spread over the 7th floor of the luxurious DPU Hi-Tech Hospital Building. We have a string of private rooms tastefully designed and an ultra-modern Labor Rooms catering to high-risk obstetrics patients who are conceiving after fertility treatment. The Centre has two in built futuristic OT complexes one is dedicated to Assisted Reproduction Procedures and the other to Endoscopic OT with 3D Laparoscopic operating system.

The most important feature of the Center is that we custom design our fertility treatments to the individual's needs. The Center offers the best possible chance of pregnancy and parenthood a couple can have. We achieve this through our ultra-modern technology in the IVF Lab, which is first of its kind in Pune. We achieve this by using Time Lapse Imaging for best Embryo selection. The other advanced technologies that have been incorporated are assisted hatching of Blastocyst to maximize implantation, no touch closed intracytoplasmic sperm injection (ICSI) chamber and Spindle imaging technology for maximum chances of fertilization.

On 25th July 2021 we opened our doors on a mission to provide comprehensive, affordable, and high-quality fertility care to our patients. Till date we have successfully treated more than 2000 patients with infertility out of which 800 patients have undergone IVF treatment. We strongly believe in delivering the highest quality fertility care at every level. High tech procedures such as Intracytoplasmic morphologically selected sperm injection (IMSI), genetic testing, Embryoscope and frozen embryo transfer (FET) are used which reflects in our high success rates of about 80% fertilization rate and > 35 % implantation rate. For patients DPU-IVF and Endoscopy center is one stop destination for all fertility related issues. We handle hundreds of the most challenging cases of infertility making us particularly well trained to help patients

achieve their dreams.

We continuously invest in our medical technology and our people. At DPU IVF, fertility treatment is led by a team of experts with a collective experience of 100 plus years. Our team includes faculty who have worked at world-renowned medical schools, with international exposure towards improving fertility treatment outcomes and have developed new medication protocols focusing on modulating the immune system for repetitive IVF implantation failures, recurrent pregnancy loss and boosting sperm, egg, embryo, and uterine quality.

Our team invests in training and bringing out proficient leaders in the field of IVF and Endoscopy. Two conferences have been organized by DPU-IVF in the year 2021. The most striking feature of this academic meeting was that surgeries were being done free of cost. The conference also included keynote addresses, panel discussions and technical sessions.

We have overcome obstacles of quality treatment by being available for all and continue to strive for a better future of fertility medicine. In future we have plans of expanding our department in fetal medicine and high-risk obstetrics to provide a more wholesome experience for the patient.

The academic calendar is prepared at institutional level and approved by Faculty, Academic Council (AC) and Board of Management (BoM). The Board of Examinations (BOE) prepares the schedule of examinations and appoints paper-setters, examiners, and moderators to ensure proper conduct of examinations/assessments.

The papers are assessed through a strictly defined Central Assessment Programme (CAP) protocol to ensure accuracy, efficiency and reliability. CCTV surveillance and mobile jammers are used in examination halls. Results are declared within a week's time.

In 2020-2021, revision of evaluation scheme was undertaken for BBA and MBA. The proportion of external and internal assessment marks was revised from 60:40 to 50:50.

Continuous Assessment methods like problem-solving assignments, MCQs, SAQs, Case Studies, Objective Structured Clinical/Practical Examinations (OSCE/OSPE), Viva-Voce, Presentations, group discussions and workplace-based assessment are routinely used for various programmes and courses.

Online counselling was used for provisional admissions to various programmes during the COVID -19 pandemic. Online grievance application and redressal system is implemented and is functioning well.

Outcome Analysis of examination results is carried out by all constituent units annually. Faculty training workshops in new assessment methods are regularly conducted.

The Institution has a fully functional IPR Cell duly approved by BoM Vide resolution Item No. BM-20-16. The cell creates awareness and sensitizes researchers on the importance of IPR. Special lectures and workshops have been organized on IPR with the following objectives:

- Awareness
- Guidance
- Commercialization

Total 6 workshops/seminars were organized on IPR during 2020 -2021. In all 4 workshops on research methodology were conducted during the 2020-2021 covering research methodology, good clinical practices, etc. Regular feedback were taken during the workshops

and were analyzed. The collaboration and partnership of DPU with industry have helped to improve the quality of education in terms of excellence, modernization, collaboration and self-reliance.DPU has also organized various workshops to strengthen teaching-learning methods. It is done by way of inviting senior industry professionals to share their rich experience with the students. These sessions have helped the students in applying those theoretical concepts into practice. The students of Business School and Biotechnology & Bioinformatics regularly opt for summer internship programs in collaboration with aforementioned industries. Out of the total 89 workshops, 6 workshops were conducted on IPR, 4 research methodology, 67 on good clinical practices and 12 on industry academia collaborations.

Revenue from licensing of IP and royalty is shared between the inventors and Vidyapeeth. The Vidyapeeth reassigns the right of IP to inventors andinventors reimburses all costs incurred by Vidyapeeth forprotection, maintenance, marketing and other expenses. The inventors reassign the right of IP to Vidyapeeth, Vidyapeeth reimburses all the costs incurred by inventors for the above purpose. The Centre conducts workshops and seminars on IPR and entrepreneurship for students and faculties on protection of IP, promote entrepreneurial skills besides providing logistical support from Ideation, incubation to post incubation stage. Constituent units have filed 49 patents/copyrights during the year. Faculties have undertaken Innovation Ambassador Training from Ministry of Education, Innovation Cell.Consultancy Policy of Vidyapeeth provides guiding principles and procedures for consultancy services by faculties, provided it does not conflict with the interests of the University. Consultancyservices have stimulated research and scholarly exchanges besides applying knowledge for solving real life problems. Faculties facilitate knowledge and technology transfer towards economic and social impact.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

- 4.1.1 The Institution has adequate physical facilities for teaching —learning, skills acquisition etc.
- Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, Pune has its spacious campus of 42.5 acres at Pimpri and Tathawade in the Pimpri-Chinchwad Municipal Corporation, an urban area. It comprises the following:

ICT-enabled Classrooms and seminar halls: Academic infrastructure of nine constituent units includes 67 well equipped Classrooms,

150 Demonstration rooms, and 48 Seminar Halls.

Facilities for Clinical learning: There are 2011 beds of Medical hospital, 425 Dental chairs, 325 of Ayurved hospital and 43 Homoeopathy hospital for bed side clinical teaching-learning.

Learning in the Community: DPU has ten Satellite Health Centers covering Rural (RHTC) and Urban (UHTC) areas.

Provisions of Museums and Skill Labs:

Provisions of physical infrastructure, learning resources, clinical learning resources, health care facilities, museums, skill laboratories are over and above the requirements of Regulatory Bodies.

Animal House:

Animal house is registered under Committee for the Purpose of Control and Supervision of Experiments on Animals (CPCSEA) (14/02/2017, R.No.619/PO/02/ReBI/S/02/CPCSEA) and maintained by Department of Pharmacology.

AYUSH Related Learning Cum Therapy Center

As a part of AYUSH systems of medicine during multi-diagnostic camps Ayurveda and Homoeopathy Hospitals provide a wide variety of treatments for acute and chronic medical conditions. In-house teaching pharmacy 'Sudhatatava' is GMP (MH/PZ3/ GMP/6095400) certified.

Recreational facilities - Two Auditoriums are available with 1000 and 250 Capacity that is used for cultural and other student council activities.

Gymnasium: DPU has provided well-equipped four gymnasiums, two for boys, two for girls and one open gymnasium. Zumba Dance facility is also available at Gymnasium.

- The hospitals have well equipped surgical suites for minor and major surgeries. Average of about 75 major & minor surgeries are being carried out in both hospitals every month with facility of live telecast.
- Daily of 6,675 Pathology, Biochemistry and Microbiology investigations and 1,030 daily radiological investigations are conducted.

Hospital Information Management System (HIMS)

A complete HIMS is developed by the Software Development Cell (SDC) of the Vidyapeeth. The students of Medical, Dental, Ayurveda, Homoeopathy, Nursing, Physiotherapy and Optometry are trained to use the HIMS.

Through regular clinical and multi-specialty postings the students get hands-on training in the respective teaching hospitals. Experience based training includes case study, case presentation, seminars, symposia, bedside teaching,

and patient's management. Students are also regularly trained to use HIMS modules.

DPU has ensured best library resources at every constitute unit. Each department has also its own departmental library. All the libraries subscribe to both print and e-journals of repute. They also subscribe to standard databases that include EBSCO HOST, SCOPUS, J-GATE, KNOWLEDGE HUB, and ELSEVIER CLINICALKEY and CLINICALFLEX STUDENT. The database facilitates search for title, subject, author, publisher, and keywords.

Every constitute unit has its own Library Committee. This committee is renewed and reconstituted at regular intervals. It meets at least twice in a year and makes recommendations regarding new purchases, library organization, facilities and so on.

Biometric attendance system: Entry and exit for all users from the library register their attendance in the library through biometric attendance system.

Radio Frequency Identification (RFID) system is used in registration and as anti-theft protection.

The DPU has about 1669 computers of which 1071 have been utilized exclusively for academic purpose by the students and the faculty members and the remaining are used for administrative work.

The computer facility in the library is utilized effectively by students for accessing e-learning resources from morning till evening. Frequent up-gradation of IT infrastructure has ensured high speed connectivity to these computers that are readily available to the faculty members and students. Hostels are also having Wi-Fi connectivity.

Up-gradations:

Wi-Fi services are available in classrooms, library and all the buildings of the Vidyapeeth. The classrooms have been upgraded with interactive display boards/ TVs making learning more effective. In addition, audio-video recording facility has been created for the development of e-content. The e-content is then uploaded on Vidyapeeth portal for access by the students for learning.

The installation of Hypervisor i.e. (Virtualization) has converted physical server into multiple virtual machines for each database module eliminating future purchases.

The content development, editing and publishing are well defined processes at DPU. Content is peer reviewed and checked for quality and plagiarism. For new program development, a thorough process is followed right from need assessment to courseware development. The program development process at DPU goes through three stages namely: program formulation, instructional design and development of courseware.

The software used is Shortcut open-source video editor, iMovie video editing for Mac, Audacity and Catwalk by Bandlab for audio editing and mixing, Adobe Premier and Adobe Aftereffect. The teachers and students are making use of e-resources through e-library and internet connectivity.

Case Study - Timely Response to Covid 19 Pandemic.

The Covid 19 Pandemic was a big challenge to the entire humanity worldwide that affected the Global Academic system as well.

Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth, in accordance with the guidelines putforth by the Central/State Government and the local municipal Councils, made sure that all Academic, Research, Extension and Clinical activities continued without any halt.

All statutory and Non Statutory bodies, various committees and the IQAC of the Vidyapeeth, in unison with the constituent units streamlined the Academic, Clinical, Research, Extension and Welfare activities by online/offline meetings for deciding and deploying the plan of action in the exceptional scenario of Covid-19. Blended mode of Teaching-Learning and Evaluation (Online/Offline) was adopted as per guidelines from regulatory authorities. Faculty and students were connected through the DPU-ERP for Teaching-Learning as well as evaluation process and students were provided all the e-resources required to meet their curriculum requirements.

The Medical and AyurvedHospital provided Covid-19 care and vaccination services besides distribution of Arsenic Album (Homeopathy Hospital) and engaged in collaborative efforts to combat Covid-19 pandemic.

This decentralized and participative effort made sure that the Academic, Research and Clinical activities continued without any major shortcomings.

Fees collected is fixed by the 'Fee Fixation Committee', which is empowered to review and revise the fee structure. The Vidyapeeth allocates the resources under various budget heads following which the institutional budget is prepared by the concerned Head of the institution taking into consideration the annual recurring and non-recurring expenditures. The Finance Committee recommends the budget to the Board of Management for its approval.

The main goal of the strategy for mobilization of funds is to ensure adequate funds flow for maintenance and development expenses for growth and expansion as per DPU-Vision 2025 document.

Optimal utilization of financial resources is done through the Annual Budget exercise. 6.4.3 - Institution conducts internal and external financial audits regularly

Internal Audit: DPU has a policy for Internal and External Audits duly approved by the Finance Committee and Board of Management that ensure financial transactions; pursue the controls and procedures with reasonable assurance that significant risk is being managed properly. Documents related to purchase, stores, cash, bank, maintenance, development passes through the hands of more than two staff which reduces the risk. While the documents are prepared by an accountant, they are also verified and authorized by higher officials.

DPU follows pre-audit to payments procedure wherein after the document has been verified, it goes for audit by the Chartered Accountant.

External Audit: DPU follows an external financial audit mechanism. The financial statements prepared by the institution are independently audited by a firm of Chartered Accountants. The external auditor is appointed by the Board of Management on the recommendation of the Finance Committee.

The external auditor scrutinizes the ledgers of the institution and makes inquiries in respect of transactions recorded. After

conducting the audit, they express their opinion in the form of an Audit Report and audited Financial Statements which is placed before the Finance Committee and BOM for approval. Finally, a consolidated financial statement of the Vidyapeeth is prepared.

7.1.3 - Describe the facilities in the Institution for the management of the following types of degradable and non-degradable waste (within 100 - 200 words)

DPU has facilities for management of degradable and nondegradable waste complying with guidelines of Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB). These are as follows:

Solid waste management

Bio- degradable solid waste of canteen and garden is composted in a vermicompost plant installed in DPU campus. Plastic is banned as per directive of Government of Maharashtra and has been strictly observed at DPU.

Liquid waste management

Vidyapeeth has four sewage treatment plants (STP) with a total capacity of 1170 m3/ day to manage the liquid waste. One effluent

treatment plant (ETP) with a total capacity of 50 m3/day and two water treatment plants (WTP) with a total capacity of 650 m3/day, have also been installed. The liquid waste management plants have been installed at a cost of more than Rs 65 lacs.

Biomedical waste management

Biomedical waste generated in the Hospitals is disposed as per norms. The waste is collected at the point of generation in prescribed colour coded bags and bins. They are segregated and stored at a specific area and handed over every day to the common disposable facility run by PCMC. All the institutes hold licenses and valid contracts from MPCB, Government of Maharashtra

E-waste management

Vidyapeeth has executed an agreement for disposal of e-waste with J.S. Enterprises along with creating awareness amongst employees and students regarding the same.

Waste recycling system

The wastewater is treated and recycled water is used for landscaping and toilets.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management

Standard protection protocols and guidelines of Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB) have been followed to ensure protection from radiation. These include:

- Protection devices like Lead shielding of adequate thickness, thyroid collar etc, is used to prevent exposure to radiation
- "Thermoluminescent Dosimeter" badge is used to monitor radiation exposure.
- All the equipment and layout plan of the Department of Radio-diagnosis and Imaging are approved by AERB.
- Periodic quality assurance, radiation safety survey, and health surveillance is conducted for all radiation generating installations and workers.
- Radiation Safety Committee is constituted.

 Licenses of all radiology equipment are renewed every five years.

7.2.1 - Describe two best practices successfully implemented by the Institution during the year as per NAAC format provided in the Manual

Best Practice 1

TITLE: 4TH GENERATION DA VINCI ROBOT FOR ROBOTIC SURGERY

1. Objective

Robotic surgery is a minimally invasive surgery that has dramatically changed the experience of surgery for patients. At DPU the fourth generation, da Vinci surgical system is in use that has enhanced cameras for 3D visualization and surgeon-controlled robotic arms for precise movements. It allows surgeons to operate on tissues and organs as in open surgery, but through a few small incisions. Robotic surgery facility at DPU provides exposure to postgraduate students in latest surgical technologies. Availability of such advanced technologies has enabled the patients of India to reduce travelling expenditure and hospitalization cost by going abroad.

2. Context

India's first robotic-assisted surgical procedure took place at Delhi in 2002. Dr. Tejas Patel, A cardiac surgeon, with the help of advanced robotics, conducted the world's first telerobotic surgery on a middle-aged woman with blocked artery while sitting 32 kilometres away from the patient. This was the world's first heart surgery from a remote location which was done in India in the year 2018. Currently 500 robotic surgeons have started practicing this type of surgery at government and private healthcare facilities in India. Benefits of this procedure enables shorter post-surgery recovery period, relatively less pain and less blood loss in robotic assisted surgeries. Hence robotic surgery is preferred over open and laparoscopic surgeries. As a result of this robotic surgeries allows the surgeons to perform complex as well as routine procedures through small incisions like traditional laparoscopy.

At Dr. D. Y. Patil Vidyapeeth Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, has always been at the forefront in advancement in medical technology. At the Centre of excellence for Robotic Surgery, we are changing the way surgeons treat patients. DPU believes in providing exemplary healthcare that translates into better healing, lesser pain, smaller incisions, and reduced hospitalization. The number of procedures performed in any facility is an indicator of expertise and level of quality, which speaks volumes about the institution. For over two decades, surgeons at DPU have led the way towards better healthcare with minimally invasive procedures. As a natural progression towards excellence, the Centre for Robotic Surgery has been established. The services are provided across multiple specialities which cohesively enhance patient outcome. Thus, DPU continues to be the

leader in surgical care, offering an extensive panel of surgeons along with trained staff and nurses who are a part of the dedicated robotic surgical team. The Centre of Excellence for Robotic surgery at DPU offers a faster, less painful surgical option so that life can be led to the fullest.

3. The Practice

Dr. D. Y. Patil Medical College, Hospital & Research Centre, Pimpri, Pune conducted the first robotic surgery on 25th June 2018 in Pimpri Chinchwad Municipal Corporation area on a newly installed latest model of the 4th generation, da Vinci Robot, manufactured by Intusive Technologies, CA, USA. A second console for training young surgeons is also provided in addition to the main console of the robotic surgeon. This machine is one of the 4th generation latest models of medical robot. DPU has one out of 3 such machines installed in the state of Maharashtra, only a few more are available all over India. At other places, 3rd generation models are in use. The cost of the machine purchased at DPU is about Rs.25 Crores.

Considering the example of conventional prostate surgery, patients stays in the hospital for 7 to 9 days post-operatively, but post-robotic surgery patient is fit for discharge by 5th day. There is gross reduction in the post-operative pain as evidenced by lower Visual Analogue Score (VAS scores) in patients who undergo robotic surgery. Also, the requirement of narcotic analgesics was significantly reduced. The average length of stay (ALOS) was 5 days and the patient returns to his daily activity much earlier thereby reducing loss of man hours and financial burden on the patients. As the surgery is undertaken via small 1 cm ports (4/5 no's) there is very little postoperative scarring as compared to conventional surgical incisions.

4. Evidence of success

Da Vinci Robot IV Generation with four arms and dual console is only one of its kind among all Medical Colleges in Maharashtra, installed in at DPU in 2018. Since then, there are 52 Robotic surgeries performed at our hospital. These include:

- Radical Prostatectomy
- Radical Hysterectomy
- · Ca Bladder surgeries like cystectomy with ileal conduit.

- Robotic assisted tubal recanalization.
- Robotic cholecystectomy.
- Robotic radical nephrectomy.

5. Problems encountered and resources required

- 1. Robotic surgery is significantly costlier than conventional laparoscopic procedure/open surgery.
- 2. Insurance companies as of now do not finance robotic surgeries.
- 3. There is lack of patient awareness regarding advantages of robotic surgery.
- 4. Equipment of robotic surgery are expensive to the tune of 22 crores.
- 5. Comprehensive maintenance cost (CMC) is about 95 lakhs/year.
- 6. Consumables used in robotic surgery are also expensive.
- 7. Space requirement for surgical robot is much more and bigger operation theatres are required.
- 8. Training and expertise are required by the surgeon which is also expensive.

BEST PRACTICE 2

TITLE: ORGAN TRANSPLANTATION INITIATIVES AT DPU MEDICAL HOSPITAL

1. Objective:

Organ Donation is retrieving donor's organs like heart, liver, kidneys, intestines, lungs and pancreas, after death or from brain-dead individuals for the purpose oftransplanting them into another person who needs an organ. It aids in saving the life of terminally ailing patients. DPU being an advanced tertiary health care centre with sophisticated and advanced surgical facilities, instrumentation and procedures, trains PG students from Medical, Surgical and Nursing specialities in human transplantation surgery, treatment, rehabilitation & follow up. The program also endeavours to create awareness about organ transplant and cadaveric organ transplant among donors. Thus, DPU also supports national programmes such as control of blindness.

2. Context:

DPU through its organ donation initiative aims to significantly reduce the mortality rate among patients with major organ failure. With the availability of good number of donors creating awareness about organ donation from live as well as brain dead/cadavers the bridge between the demand and supply of organs can be reduced. With our state of art organ transplant facility, the objective is to save lives, improve transplantation outcomes and reduce recipients waiting time. It also increases opportunities for patients without living donors to receive organs from deceased donors. Training of superspecialists as well as postgraduate students in organ transplantation is the need of the hour, that is being partly fulfilled through this initiative.

3. Practice:

DPU has a state of art modular OTs with Da Vinci Robotic Surgical System. This supports organ transplant facility in various departments such as CVTS, Cardiology, Nephrology, Urology, Gastroenterology and Ophthalmology. Internationally qualified superspecialists are available to conduct these procedures. The support system required for the organ transplant surgeries such as critical support services, ICUs, nursing staff and other state of the art support facilities are available at DPU with well-trained manpower.

4. Evidence of success

A great variety of organ transplant procedures have been conducted in DPU for the last several years. The transplants include renal, liver, cornea, and heart. The statistical data for the same is given as follows:

The major problems encountered in this endeavour is creating awareness and sensitization of the community towards organ donation. These challenges have been overcome to a large extent with the help of various NGO's.

The other critical challenge is management of brain-dead patients who are potential cadaveric donors. Meticulous attention to hemodynamic and hormonal changes with goal directed intensivist management can have a profound impact on organ eligibility and retrieval rates.

The facility provides exceptional, personalized reproductive and fertility health care to the patients. The facility follows a

three-step approach that is affordable IVF treatment, highly trained gynecologists in IVF with extensive research and development. The advanced facility is designed to ensure maximum safety and minimal stress to the patients during treatment. The proficient team of experts guides the couples from the initial stage when they first arrive at the Centre and advises them to choose the right options. The patient is also educated regarding the various treatment options available and its costeffectiveness. The quality of the treatment provided at the DPU IVF and Endoscopy Center is on par with the best IVF Centers across the world. We have a string of private rooms tastefully designed and an ultra-modern Labor Rooms catering to high-risk obstetrics patients who are conceiving after fertility treatment. The Centre has two in built futuristic OT complexes one is dedicated to Assisted Reproduction Procedures and the other to Endoscopic OT with 3D Laparoscopic operating system.

The most important feature of the Center is that we custom design our fertility treatments to the individual's needs. The Center offers the best possible chance of pregnancy and parenthood a couple can have. We achieve this through our ultra-modern technology in the IVF Lab, which is first of its kind in Pune. We achieve this by using Time Lapse Imaging for best Embryo selection. The other advanced technologies that have been incorporated are assisted hatching of Blastocyst to maximize implantation, no touch closed intracytoplasmic sperm injection (ICSI) chamber and Spindle imaging technology for maximum chances
